SVSU Game Notes

This Week

The Cardinals will hit the road for one last weekend during the regular season, this time their longest trip of the season, to Houghton, Mich. to battle the Huskies of Michigan Tech. The Cardinals took a big step last weekend towards the 2009 NCAA Playoffs with a dominating 42-14 victory over Ashland University.

Michigan Tech comes into this Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) match-up looking to finish the season strong after a slow start to the season. The Huskies sit at 1-6 overall on the season and have been plagued by the injury bug all season, but play like a different team inside the confines of Sherman Field. The Cardinals, on the other hand, enter the game with a 4-1 record on the road and aspirations of an NCAA Playoff birth at the end of the season. SVSU is coming off its most complete game of the season against Ashland and looks to be hitting the right stride for the final three game stretch of the season.

The Cardinals defeated Michigan Tech last season, 40-23, behind a career day from former SVSU standout Brandon Emeott at Wickes stadium on senior day. The Cardinals have won the last two meetings and hold a 15-7 advantage all-time against the Huskies. SVSU last won at Sherman Field in 2003, when the Cardinals left Houghton with a 34-32 victory.

Cardinal Rankings

The Cardinals appear in only one top-25 poll this week, #16 in the D2Football.com poll, but received the number three ranking in this weeks edition of the NCAA Regional Playoff rankings, released on Monday (Oct. 19).

Jacobs Ladder

John Jacobs (Prudenville, Mich./Midland Dow HS) is now in sole possession of second place all-time on the career tackles list with 372, moving past Darrel Bartowiak (357) this past weekend. He now sits just 93 tackles behind John DiGiorgio's 462 career tackles mark that was set in 2005. Jacobs ranks first all time on the career tackles for loss list with 50.5, he has also moved into a tie for 15th place on the all-time sacks list with Greg Williams (14).

Jacobs has recorded double digits tackles in 13 of his last 18 games since the beginning of the 2008 season. He recorded 131 tackles in 2008, best in the nation and the sixth best season by a Cardinal. He is on pace for another season of 130 plus tackles.

Mike in the Middle

Senior middle linebacker Mike LeVand (Grandville, Mich.) has recorded 87 tackles this season, building on a new career high. For his career, he has racked-up 254 tackles, good for a tie for 17th all-time and 33 tackles for loss, good for 5th all-time.
